GETTING AROUND THE FESTIVAL

Bath is a small city and easy to get round on foot, but it's also well served by city buses into the evening. Larkhall (Rondo Theatre) is on buses 6a&7, and not at all far from the no.3&13 (the stop is by Grosvenor Place), or the buses to Chippenham [X31] and Devizes [272].

Alice Park is just past Larkhall going out of town on the A4, it's a stroll from the centre of the village (the buses go to the Bladud's Head pub, which is closer), but the 3&13 & country buses as above are even closer, the stop is Lambridge.

Burdall's Yard is an easy walk from the centre, but also on bus routes via London Road, eg. 3&13, as above.

Bath University is on regular buses U1 & U2 – NB there are timetable changes around Fringe time because term has ended.

GETTING BACK LATE

Trains run back to Bristol late, about hourly until just after 1 am, except Sunday when it's 23:35.

Trains run to Chippenham, Swindon and London till 22:46, 22:54 on Friday & Saturday – oh and 22:43 on Sundays.

They also run to Bradford, Trowbridge, Westbury, & Frome at 9 minutes past midnight [wasn't that a film?] except Friday when it's 00:04, Saturday, when it's 23:30, and, awkwardly for some, on Sunday the later ones [up to 23:44] only go as far as Westbury (last to Frome 21:07).

Check engineering work and timetable changes before entrusting yourself to the last train in vain.

Buses to Bristol via Saltford & Keynsham run all evening hourly until 2am (except Sunday to 23:13), and there are now night buses from central Bristol to the suburbs too.\Buses also run from Bath to Frome, Bradford, & Trowbridge and all points between until 23:10, except Sunday.

NB The Rondo adds a theatre restoration levy of £1.50 per ticket. This levy applies to all transactions, whether made in person at our Box Office, by post or by phone, for all payment types. Telephone bookings incur an additional £1.80 booking fee

FaB at Newark Works [and the shows elsewhere] is a good place to hang out during the day, of course, but by the time the sun is over the yard-arm or has disappeared completely, you'll want to be visiting our supporters and participating venues. Should you feel peckish, **Green Park** Brasserie (Page 8) at Green Park Station is a long-time Fringe supporter, and has live music half the week, or there's the Bath Pizza Co. out the back too, all running till later in the evening than most of the city. For music, see their ad on page 31. And though of course they'll serve you a drink there too, if you like late nights and a befuddling choice of tipples [come on, it's a festival!], you'll



want to stop at The Grapes on Westgate Street - that is assuming that you weren't already there at one of their events, see programme pages, something on most days of the festival - open till 1am every night except Friday & Saturday [2am] and Sunday [midnight]. Unlike Bath's other late bars both of these keep their music to a level at which it is still possible to converse, so if you want to unravel the intricacies of the play you just saw, analyse the art, or explain how you would have played piano as well as that chap if only you'd stuck to the lessons, well you still can, and you might even find a Fringe organiser there to buy a drink for in gratitude. To buy us a drink the rest of the year, of course, you want to make it to Bath's year round free live music central, The Bell Inn on Walcot Street (more regular pub hours) where our offices are.

A MOVING PERFORMANCE

The return of some serious dance programming to the Fringe is a sure sign of the strength of the post-pandemic performance community. Nova Grace's 'Unlocked' [June 1&2] is a celebration of precisely that, the creative spirit that survived and even thrived in lockdown, and 'Making a Song & Dance About It' [May 31] explores that same theme via a soundtrack [one of Brian Madigan's



more cerebral compositions] also extrapolating from the pandemic. The 2nd half of that show includes the singer/ songwriter material that Brian is usually known for in the Fringe, though the composer rather than the songwriter is the day job. This Fringe also features a stonking Flamenco show on June 11th, and an appearance from Bath's own Yama [May 26], Finally, Seizing The Day Company's Bluffing Your Way In Ballet [June 5,6,7] not only shows and tells, but also gives you a chance at a hands-on (feet-on? points-on?) workshop before the show.

DAME TO FAME

Four of the most interesting shows in the festival are effectively carried by solo female performers with [a variety of devices and occasionally even people] in support. Don't let the title of Clare Parry's Boorish Trumpson [June 10] put you off, it turns out you do want

to see another show about those two plonkers when it's a solo clown tour de force. **Anu Vaidyanathan**, in *Blimp* [June 7] gives us the tale of a culture-crossed Indian Film-maker, as comedy, not tragedy. And the Femmes du Monde presentation of the epoch-making Queen of the Music Hall, Marie Lloyd [June 4&5], is a performance worthy of its subject, and doesn't neglect the sense of humour for which she so often fell foul of the censors. Oh, and when it comes to the censors, Helen Prior's show [June 7] is based on her book Adventures of an Old CxNT.



SEEN AT THE THE SUNNY SIDE

The Fringe has not been able

to present its usual Outdoor

Arts events this year (again), because we didn't receive any funding for the work, which is impossible without sponsorship or subsidy. We will be looking at other ways of funding the event for 2024. In the meantime, if you enjoy seeing work without a roof over its head, there will be Art on the streets in the FaB programme, see for example Openings Night [May 26]; Queen of the East, an ingenious eco-puppet show in a pleasant church garden in Walcot [June 10]; and a whole afternoon of performance and other activities outdoors hosted by the Natural Theatre

Co. in **Radstock** on Sunday

DON'T JUST SIT AND TAKE IT

You don't need to be a passive audience any longer, many of the best performance experiences of our era are interactive. It's a Trap! [June 3] is an unscripted Star Wars, spinning off into the galaxies, one for the fans and the futurists among us. Impro Wolves [May 28] is more the classic kind of audience suggestions impro that can spin off itself into realms of hilarity and absurdity beyond the possibility of predictability. And games developer Alistair Aitcheson's Crowd Creativity Show [May 31] lets you run the show in real time from your phone - ironically, all those things you can't really do with a show on a screen, no matter how big your red button is.





LAUGHTER & AFTER

We might only be Bath's number 2 comedy festival, but **Bath Comedy Festival** put events into ours too, and the laugh riot of the fortnight is compounded by shows at *The Rondo* & Burdall's Yard. The hot ticket in standup would seem to be **Will Duggan** at The Rondo [June 2] but all tastes



are catered for, try something gentler and more local, the Bill Smarme origin story at Burdalls, also on June 2nd, or the Walcot Comedy Club featuring the bizarre Dickie Richards, June 9th, 2 shows.

ACTING UP

It might seem as though oldschool theatre performance was vanishing under a forest of hybrids. If however you want to see great theatre done in the more usual way - but don't forget this is Fringe - let us recommend, on June 8&9 respectively, **Scott Jerram**'s Sci-Fi setup 'Human Nature' or Really Truly Theatre Company's 'Celebrate Me', a play also about human nature, and families. And please don't disregard the attractive energy of the student shows, always among the most entertaining experiences of the festival, see shows from BUST and BUSMS (yes, yes, OK...) on 9-11 June at The Mission and The Edge.

Singer has been receiving great reviews. Regular Fringe venues like Chapel Arts come up with the goods, check contemporary British Bluesman Mississippi MacDonald [June 9]; The Bell has an all-new fortnight and some outliers - look for theatrical dance combo Seas of Mirth [May 31] and Walcot veteran Ted Milton with Blurt [May 20]; The Grapes has something most days, with a particular strength in female acoustic performers [Lauren Bradford, Charlie Limm, May 28 & June 4 respectively] - but there are Fringe music events all over the city, even an enthusiastic billing out in Larkhall [Eva Scott, June 9th]

When it comes to music not built around guitars (at least not ordinary ones) this year's Fringe offers you a tour du monde as well as several tours de force: music from France, Brazil, Spain, [June 4, 8, 11 respectively] Canada [Le Vent du Nord, May 28, are a real coup for a venue the size of the Social Club] and let us particularly draw your attention to the Eastern-via-Easton chamber-folk of **Troyka** Mala because it's part of a season on music to immerse yourself in upstairs at *The Grapes*, indeed it's called The Living Room, as is the room there [June 9]. There is also, of course, the extraordinary Harp-Guitar [June 10] and the bare-bones vocal of the Tryani Collective [May 29], but when it comes to the human voice all else shrinks to very little in front of the major spectacle that is June 10th's Choirthon: 20 choirs in 10 hours (or select your own preferred duration) an event of a scale and variety not seen before in this fair city.


